President's Report

Season 2018 has concluded and the club has continued to grow and build. It is disappointing to be relegated to Premier C for 2019 however the club has grown in numbers fielding 7 teams in 2018. We fielded Seniors and Reserves in Premier B, Under 19'S Section 3 & 5, reintroduced the Third 18 and fielded 2 Women's team.

Football

Having stayed in Premier B, the club had hopes of playing competitive footy in 2018. The club had a positive start to the year with 2 wins from 5 games and it seemed as though we would be capable of playing some good footy against some strong opposition. Unfortunately, a run of injuries to our Senior players tested the club's depth, the losses mounted and confidence was battered. A win against Monash in Round 10 gave us a glimmer of hope that we could turn our fortunes around however we struggled for the rest of the year and unfortunately finished at the bottom of Premier B. The Reserves battled hard all year but again was undermanned and struggled to be competitive. We were able to give many of our young players a taste of Senior Premier B football which was a very strong competition especially the top 5 sides and hopefully that experience hold us in good stead next year. The club fielded a Third 18 team this year and this team had great success making a Preliminary Final.

Our underage program was strengthened with the reintroduction of a second Under 19 team. The Under 19 Blues were Grand Finalists in Section 3 whilst the Under 19 Blacks finished in the bottom half of Section 5. This was huge for the club to have over 50 young men eligible for Under 19 football. A large number of Under 19 boys were giving the opportunity to play Senior football and hopefully the experience gained from this will help build our depth for next year and beyond.

The club fielded 2 Women's teams in 2018, an unbelievable achievement in 2 years. Unfortunately, the VAFA put the Women's up 3 divisions and the fact that a lot of the girls hadn't played before made the year a struggle on field however the advantage of having 2 Women's teams is huge for the club off field and continues to change the dynamic of the club in a positive sense.



To all the coaches, Ben Phibbs, Tim Bourbon, Wayne Poulter, Steve Balloch, Paul Deegan, Tom De Young, Damian Sherlock, Matt Backhouse, the assistants and support staff many thanks for your hard work and congratulations on the season. To Ben Phibbs our outgoing Senior coach, you should be extremely proud of your 3 years at the helm, a Premiership but also you gave many of our young players an opportunity to play Senior footy. To Ben Phibbs, the player, the club has been privileged to have such a fantastic player grace our presence, you will certainly go down as one of the club's greats when you eventually retire. We wish Liz, Kai, Taj and yourself all the best in the future.

Thanks to Phil Ryan for taking on the role of FIDA President, your passion and thirst to make the program better was greatly appreciated. Many thanks to your committee and all the volunteers that give people not as fortunate as many of us an opportunity to play and to be involved in club environment. It is great to see the joy that they get out of being involved in playing sport.

This night provided a great opportunity for all those who have been involved in the MOCFC to gather to share experiences and talk about the old times, stories become bigger and better every year. Thanks to the Past Players and Supporters Association for your help with the night's organisation.

Financial

Like most years, it is a tough task to make end meet. The canteen, bar sales and social functions contribute to our financial result, however the club must continue to generate more revenue through Sponsorship and through the Club 200 membership. Our aim is to significantly increase Sponsorship and our membership in the Club 200 by 50% next year.

Administration Report

Season 2018 saw the Club move forward in a number of important aspects. One of the most significant was the upgrade to our website which enabled us to launch an online shopping portal for the first time and channel payments for registrations, memberships and social functions through the online shop. This has kick-started a much more efficient way of managing the Club's finances and further improvements are anticipated in this area in 2019. The new site has also integrated the Club's email communications with our membership base, creating a more effective process in liaising electronically with our players, supporters and families. The new website was made possible by the generous support of the Past Players & Supporters Association – we thank them for their ongoing support and financial assistance.

At last year's AGM, we launched a new committee structure with a focus on spreading the workload and making involvement more sustainable for our volunteers. We had immediate success with this process, as a number of new people joined the committee and contributed significantly to the management of the Club throughout 2018. We will continue to explore avenues to improve the recruitment and retainment of our highly valued volunteers.

The Club commenced its strategic planning process during the season, with various meetings taking place between MOCFC Executive members, Monash Council staff and Councillors, Waverley Park Hawks Executive members (our Junior football affiliate), MOCA and members of the Leadership Team at Mazenod College. An initial planning session was held at the College in July and some excellent discussion ensued. The focus over the coming months will be to further develop that planning process, engaging with our community as required, and to launch the 2019 – 2022 Strategic Plan for the commencement of next season. This plan will provide a framework for us to work from that will lead to improvements across all areas of the Club – our ultimate aim is to make Mazenod *THE* destination club in the City of Monash.

Despite the Club's "amateur" status, it continues to be run in a very professional manner, with an amazing group of dedicated and skilled volunteers. Under the leadership of Chris Smith and the guidance of a number of key men and women, we have seen significant growth and the strengthening of relationships with our affiliate bodies and a greater connection with our members. Our challenge is to manage that process effectively so that we continue to improve our on-field and off-field performance and build on the incredible work done by so many people in our Club's 40-year history.

Thank-you to all of those that have supported the administration process this season and I look forward to continuing to help develop the Club in 2019 and beyond.

Football Report

In season 2018, the football department was hopeful again of consolidating in Premier B. Pre-season presented some early challenges, with senior assistant coaches stepping down, some retirements of senior players, and some uncertainty around commitment of recent premierships stars. Senior coach, Ben Phibbs' enthusiasm however, remained high. Pre-season charged ahead, while the committee went about filling the vacant coaching positions, including those of the new/ returning teams. 2018 saw the return of a thirds team, along with an additional U/19 team, and an additional women's team. This took the senior clubs total to 7 VAFA teams. A huge effort, and testament to the hard work of many that Mazenod is now by far the strongest senior club in the region.

After a strong 2017, expectation was high for the senior team. A reasonably strong start the season had the team sitting on 2 wins after 5 rounds. But injury to key personnel, and unavailability meant only 1 more win for the season, and a bottom place finish. The club, and its senior team will look to rebuild in Premier C in season 2019.

At this point, I would like to personally thank Ben Phibbs for his outstanding contribution to the football club. No doubt the tributes will continue to flow for Ben, not only for his footballing ability, and his contribution as a coach over the past three seasons, but also as an outstanding friend and member of the Mazenod community. We wish him all the best.

The reserves, in season 2018, were led by co-coaches, Wayne Poulter, and Steve Balloch. Their season somewhat mirrored that of the senior team, and injuries etc had a flow-on effect through the grades. Steve and Wayne continued to promote players to senior level, and the experience proved invaluable. The enthusiasm of the reserves team remained high all season, and this attitude no doubt will prove to be a building block of the clubs rebound.

The returns of the thirds also meant the return of some club stalwarts, along with some new faces to the club. Tom De Young led the team brilliantly to the finals, and the presence of the team within the Mazenod OCFC community is vital to our success. The club looks forward to providing this playing opportunity again in 2019.

As mentioned earlier, the club made a concerted effort to bring back its 2 U/19 teams for 2018. Strong numbers early in pre-season meant we could make the decision early to push forward with both teams. New coaches Damien Sherlock, and Matt Backhouse did a power of work to make this happen, and the results spoke for themselves, with the 'Blues' team returning to the grand final in search of back to back success. Unfortunately, the boys fell short on the day, but a huge congratulation goes to all the entire squad (blues and black), and both their coaches. The strong U/19 legacy has been continued and looks to progress well in to the future.

Our Women's program took another positive step in 2018. Thanks to Paul Deegan's huge efforts, we were able to add a second women's team. Under VAFA rules, this meant that both teams had to take



the big step to premier football, given that we were fielding two teams. Unfortunately, this meant that results were tough. The experience the girls got from playing such quality opposition will hold them in good stead. But more importantly, the manner in which they all conducted themselves throughout the season is to be commended. Well done to Paul and the girls.

Again, I think the strength of the committee again grew this season. I would like to thank the entire committee, and the executive for their contribution in 2018. Given that we are a football club, the football department essentially encompasses all of you, so to all that volunteer their time, in any small or large way, thank you. (The list of individual thank you's could go on forever, but you all know who you are, and hopefully I've been able to get to you at some stage to thank you personally).

Treasurers Report

Season 2018 had its challenges both on and off the field. With higher demands on our time and finances, I am pleased to announce a \$9K improvement on the bottom line from season 2017, although we have posted a small loss for season 2018.

We experienced a 16% increase in overall Sales on the back of a 63% increase in Bar Takings (+\$12.8K), 66% increase in Player Contributions (+\$19.5K) and 125% increase in Merchandise Sales (+\$5.3K). This is a fantastic result considering we failed to attract a major sponsor and lost a 2nd tier sponsor (minimum \$15K) and had a reduction in Club 200 membership by over \$8.4K.

In relation to our Cost of Sales, we experienced a 26% increase in overall Costs. With the increase in the number of teams VAFA payments increased by 77% (\$18.8K – includes the player Insurance of \$5.25K, so adjusted to 55% if this is removed as this was recorded under Insurance Costs in 2017), Merchandise and Club Jumpers/Socks increased by \$11K due to additional club Jumpers for the new teams (although still holding \$11K of stock for sale next year that has been expensed this year), and an 18% increase in Bar stock due to the increased demand over the bar at functions. All other Cost of Sales were managed to the 2017 levels or below.

In relation to Operating Expenses, we experienced a 25% decrease in overall expenses (-\$15.3K). Despite a 97% increase in Ground and Pavilion Rental (+\$4K – 25% increase by council and increased teams) and the full impact of eCart fees (+\$2.6K) our greatest gain was in the reduction in Sponsorship expenses (-\$14.2K) and Club 200 expenses (-\$4.8K : initial purchase of jackets and keyrings). All other Operating Expenses were managed to budgeted levels or below.

Overall, in testing financial times and the increased costs of additional teams and council charges, the result for season 2018 was very satisfying. Planning for Season 2019 is already underway with a Sponsorship committee already formed with a target of \$50K and Tim Smith taking over the management of the Club 200 Memberships with an aim of 125-150 members (an increase of \$13K - \$18K).

Senior Report

After winning seven games in Premier B in 2017 and with the additions of Tom Warby, Josh Muling, Shaun Lovell (on a full time basis) and the return of Senior Vice Captain Stuart Inglis from a long term knee injury, expectations were high as we looked to build on the success of the previous last two years. There was an air of confidence around the group as we had a core group of experienced players as well as a number of talented youngsters who knew what was required at Premier B level.

This level of excitement was quickly subdued during the pre-season, as a number of players who had played a lot of senior football over the past years, decided that they would not be playing for one reason or another. This is one of the constant challenges within local football, as young people have a lot of opportunities and interests in today's society and their football club is no longer the epic centre of their universe. This makes retention of players, the key foundation of a successful club, the basis for sustained success and continual improvement.

From the twenty two players who played 11 or more senior games in 2017, only 5 of those managed to play the same amount or more senior games in 2018. Five players who played 11 or more games in 2017, didn't play a senior game (Luke Greco, Damian Byrne, Jaydyn Hill, Patrick Flanagan and Xavier Patti), while staples of the senior side and premiership players Brad Kovac (4 games), Stephen Welsford (4 games) and Nick Thomas (2 games) all had either late starts or early finishes to their senior seasons.

Despite the setbacks, there were still plenty of positives to take out of the preseason including:

- The appointment of club legend Tim Bourbon to the position of Senior Assistant Coach
- The reappointment of club captain Rob Mann and vice-captain Stuart Inglis
- The appointment of vice-captain Tom Warby and Liam Riley and Gus Patti to the senior leadership group
- The confirmation of two U'19 teams to be coached by Damian Sherlock and Matt Backhouse
- Goy Lok (Casey) continuing to use Mazenod OCFC as his second club
- 5 U'19 players on TAC Cup Lists Atu Bosenavulagi, Matthew Fewings and Vincent Zagari (Oakleigh Chargers), Jack Sullivan and Chayce Black (Eastern Ranges)

After two solid practice matches against quality opposition, Knox (EFL Division 1) and St. Bedes Mentone (VAFA Premier A) we headed, without fear or trepidation into Round 1 against Uni Blacks, a team unlucky to be relegated from Premier A and still containing a fair chunk of their 2014 Premier A premiership team. We started well and played some excellent football in the first quarter and managed to get within four goals early in the last term, but the gulf in class was evident as the Blacks' quality shone through to run out easy winners. To make matters worse and what was a precursor and what was to follow, one of our senior players, Simon Hall, suffered a long term injury that would unfortunately rule him out for close to four months.

The next week we faced Ajax in our first home game of the year. Three U'19 players, Chayce Black, Connor Dixon and Matthew Fewings, would make their debut and bring plenty of pace and excitement



to the senior team. We played some very good football and had an even contribution from all twenty two players.

We took plenty of confidence from the game as we headed into two big games against quality opposition in Old Carey (7 players with AFL experience) and Beaumaris (2017 Premier A, 2016 Premier B Premiers). In both games the effort, endeavour and desire was evident, but both sides were a class above with both quality and depth.

Next up was a huge game against Monash, who were in similar position to us. It was also a big day for the club, with the Mazenod OCFC 40th Anniversary celebrations being held that night. With Christina Poretti patrolling centre half back, Gus Patti dominating the forward 50 and young guns Jarryd Raffa, Matthew Fewings and Mitchell D'Angelo lively, we played easily our best games of the season and ran out convincing winners by more than twelve goals.

St Bernards followed at home, which was always going to be a tough assignment. They were unlucky not to be promoted at the end of 2017 and they were clearly the best side in the competition and really controlled the game from the outset. To make matters worse, we lost two of our most important players in Gus Patti (hamstring) and Rob Mann (broken leg). While Gus would eventually find his way back, the injury to Rob was devastating as there are not many who put more into their football within the amateur environment. Unfortunately for Rob, it was the last game of his season and led to a recovery period of what will end up being close to twelve months.

Event though, that put a dampener on things, we had plenty to look forward to, as our next game was the annual Founders' Day match, this time against a Caulfield side who had been promoted after playing in the 2017 Premier C Grand Final. It was also Liam Riley's first time captaining a club, which was a fantastic achievement and represents a huge turnaround from someone who left the club at the end of 2015. Caulfield completely outplayed us and this was probably the moment that us as coaching group, realised the impact of the injuries to senior players, the loss of a number of senior players and the lack of depth of the playing group. We were playing a team who we should have been very competitive against and competing for a win. Instead we looked second rate, slow and poor with the football. It was a disappointing effort, considering the magnitude of the day and our first senior loss on Founders' Day. As a group we now had to reconsider where we were at as a senior team and adjust our goals for the rest of the year.

A huge two weeks were in front of us, as we faced Old Haileybury (winless up until this stage) and Parkdale, with both games away from home and to have huge consequences on our season. Against Old Haileybury, Atunaisa Bosenavulagi, listed at the Oakleigh Chargers and Jack Sullivan, listed at the Eastern Ranges, both made their debuts, while it was great to have Senior Vice-Captain Stuart Inglis back on the park after more than twelve months sidelined with a knee injury. It was great to see Stu back on the park, after all the hard work he had put into his recovery. Unfortunately it didn't help with the result, as we confronted a team who were hungry and determined to break through for their first win of the year. We then headed down the Nepean Highway to face Parkdale. This was a massive game for both teams which would have giant repercussions for both sides. It was a tight affair with Parkdale managed to get out to a substantial lead in the third quarter. Even though we took the game on in the



last quarter and played some exciting football, it was not enough as Parkdale held on for a five point victory.

After a very demanding nine week period, the bye came at a good time, as it gave us time to assess the season, give everyone a much needed break and plan for the following three week block, which included winnable games against Monash and Ajax.

After the break, we faced Monash who were fighting for their survival in Premier B. I pity anyone who had to sit through the game as it wasn't the greatest advertisement for our much loved game, by any stretch of the imagination! In the end we managed to get our third win of the season, which was a most deserved win considering all the efforts the players had put in.

The win generated some momentum as we looked to win consecutive games for the first time in the season. An Ajax team lay in wait and we would have to beat them on their turf for the first time in living memory. The task was made even harder with Tom Warby injuring himself in the warm up and Jarryd Raffa going down with a knee injury. The effort and endeavour was there again, but Ajax proved too good on the day.

With injuries mounting, we faced the daunting task of facing Beaumaris on their home deck. Liam Sherlock made his debut as we made the journey out to play a side primed for an opportunity to reaffirm their position in the top 4. We were already up against it before we took the field, with two withdrawals from the selected side on Thursday and a further withdrawal on the Saturday morning. Matt Sier ended up coming into the senior side, despite having played a quarter and half in the reserves. Things didn't get any better as we lost Daniel Wiles (ankle) and Stuart Inglis (hamstring) before the end of the first quarter. A heavy defeat ensued, but it was good to see a number of players leaving everything on the field including Tom McKenna in a tagging role, Matt Sier who ended up playing close to a game and a half on the day and Liam Riley who continued to lead from the front.

It didn't get any easier after the bye as we faced the eventual grand finalists, in Old Carey and St Bernards. Against Old Carey, we were excellent in the first half and went into the break only two points behind and a really sense that we could pull an upset off. As with a young, inexperienced group, we were unable to sustain the pressure and eventually went down by close to goals. It was pleasing to see a number of players, who hadn't played a lot of senior football such as Declan Fowler, Ben Riley and Daniel Hayes contribute and show they belonged at Premier B level.

We took plenty out of the game as we headed up the Tullamarine to face a St Bernards side clearly above any other team in Premier in 2018. We were easily defeated and it was a hard day for all those involved. It was one of the toughest days for me as a coach and highlighted a few issues that the club faced as we had grown so rapidly on the field, with the addition of a number of extra teams, but weren't able to match the grown on field, with the off field support systems. It is challenge for the club to meet, as it is great to have these extra teams, but it shouldn't come at the expense of the jewel in the crown of the club, which is, at the moment, a Premier B Senior Men's team.



We gathered on Tuesday for a bit of fun and pizza and we looked to pick up the pieces and confront another challenge. In what ultimately became our grand finale, we faced a Parkdale side, who themselves needed one more win to solidify their spot in Premier B for 2019. We again let them get out to a comfortable lead, before pegging them back and hitting the front in the last quarter. Again, we were unable to get across the line as a late goal gave Parkdale the win and consolidation in Premier B. For us, it was a cruel blow both mentally and physically. There were no words to describe the feeling after the game as many players were brought to tears and as you see the tears running down the faces, you realise how much these young men have invested into their football. All they wanted was to link arms, embrace and sing *It's a Grand Old Flag* just one more time.

Even though we had another bye before three games to conclude the year, the mental and physical scars had taken their toll and we limped through the final stages of the season. A revitalised Old Haileybury never gave us a chance, while heavy losses followed against finals bound Caulfield and University Blacks.

The farewell I received before, from the players and after from the supporters and officials was greatly appreciated and I thank everyone that played a part in it, especially Rosie Welsford for the banner. I was truly humbled and I, as well as my family have grown and developed at the club and we will take away lifelong memories.

It was a bittersweet way to finish my position as Senior Coach, as the club was in the same position it was when I took the reins at the end of 2015. Even though we only won three games and were heavily defeated, I believe that us as a coaching group did everything we could to put the club in a position to play Premier B in 2019. A number of factors conspired against the senior team and as a result we weren't good enough on the field to win the necessary amount of games required to stay in Premier B. Even though it was a tough and challenging there are many positives to take out of the season. These include the development of Liam Riley, the consistency of Josh Muling, the resilience of the playing group, Shaun Lovell playing representative football, two U'19 teams and the development of a number of younger players such as Christian Poretti, Ben Riley, Sam Deegan, Tom Odrowaz and Chris Campbell. It is now up to these players to support the senior core, to ensure they develop into key components of the senior side. With that we had ten players to make their senior debut:
